In our music this Lent we have looked at various crises, from the plight of individuals to the plight of nations, and today as Holy Week begins, all the crises of the ages come together and march into Jerusalem. “All Glory, Laud, and Honor,” “Ride On! Ride On in Majesty,” and “Lift Up Your Heads, Ye Mighty Gates” peal out in a medley for handbells to announce the entrance of Jesus into the holy city. The people are joyous who soon will be taunting. Those in power will do what they will to keep it, from the Roman empire to our own today. Our faults, our transgressions, personal and public, come to a head as Jesus takes on the sins of the world. And he will be murdered by the authorities for it. “O Sacred Head,” set in the choral offertory to an American folk hymn, sings to the sacrifice he is to make: “What Thou, my Lord, hast suffered was all for sinners’ gain; mine, mine was the transgression, but Thine the deadly pain.” For now, though, we sing our hosannas to the one who took on death and empire—perhaps the greatest conglomeration of our vanities and cruelties we have yet conceived—to bring us a greater life.

These stanzas for Palm Sunday have been selected and translated from a much longer Latin poem written by a bishop who was the leading theologian in Charlemagne's court. They are sung to a 17th-century German chorale, as adapted for these words in the mid-19th century.

The opening two stanzas narrate the first Palm Sunday in the past tense, but the third stanza shifts to the present tense to emphasize what current singers do and believe. The repeated elements in this anonymous German tune suggest the repetitive patterns in a crowd's chant.
