



About the Music by Christian Hendricks

"Day of delight and beauty unbounded, tell the news, the gospel spread!" While the words for the hymn "Day of Delight and Beauty Unbounded" come from the 1990's, the tune for our prelude comes from the 1590's, a dance written by Giovanni Giacomo Gastoldi. It is a time to celebrate, why not dance?

The "Great Gate of Kyiv" is from Pictures at Exhibition, by Modest Mussorgsky. Each of the pieces in the suite is a musical depiction of a work by Mussorgsky's friend Viktor Hartmann, who had died suddenly the previous year. Concluding the suite, "Great Gate of Kyiv" was a drawing of a proposed magnificent gate for the city.

First the gates of Jerusalem were opened to Jesus, now the gates of heaven—this music expresses the grandeur of the matter.

"To the Lamb on the Throne" is Dan Forrest's setting of Charles Wesley's "Ye Servants of God," with it's repeated refrain of "Worthy the Lamb." It is our big Easter anthem with brass and choir coming together to "adore and give Him his right." The congregation are encouraged to join in for the final verse, which is printed in the bulletin.

We also have two well-known pieces by Händel. First is the hymn "Thine Is the Glory," adapted from a chorus first found in the oratorio Joshua and then in Judas Maccabeus. And then we conclude with one of the oldest continuously performed pieces in the West, the great "Hallelujah" chorus from Messiah, which concludes the second part of the oratorio, depicting the Passion and God's Triumph.

Sing a New Song: A History of Music and the Church in the West

The presence of any element in our worship is the result of millennia of question, debate, acceptance, even compromise, and the matter of music is no different. For four weeks, beginning May 4th, we'll survey the 2000 years of history of music as it relates to Christianity, exploring the different perspectives on the role music should (or should not) play in worship, what kinds of music should be allowed, the interplay between sacred and secular developments in Western music, and so on. This broad overview is designed to educate on the topic, as well as to open questions for yourself about what music and belief means to you. While we will be using Paul Westermeyer's *Te Deum: The Church and Music* as a focus text, it is not required to participate, and while topics of musicology and music theory will be discussed as necessary, the seminars are designed with the musical layperson in mind. Please come join the Adult Discipleship class on Sundays at 11:30 in the parlor of Memorial Hall as Christian Hendricks leads us on a musical journey.
