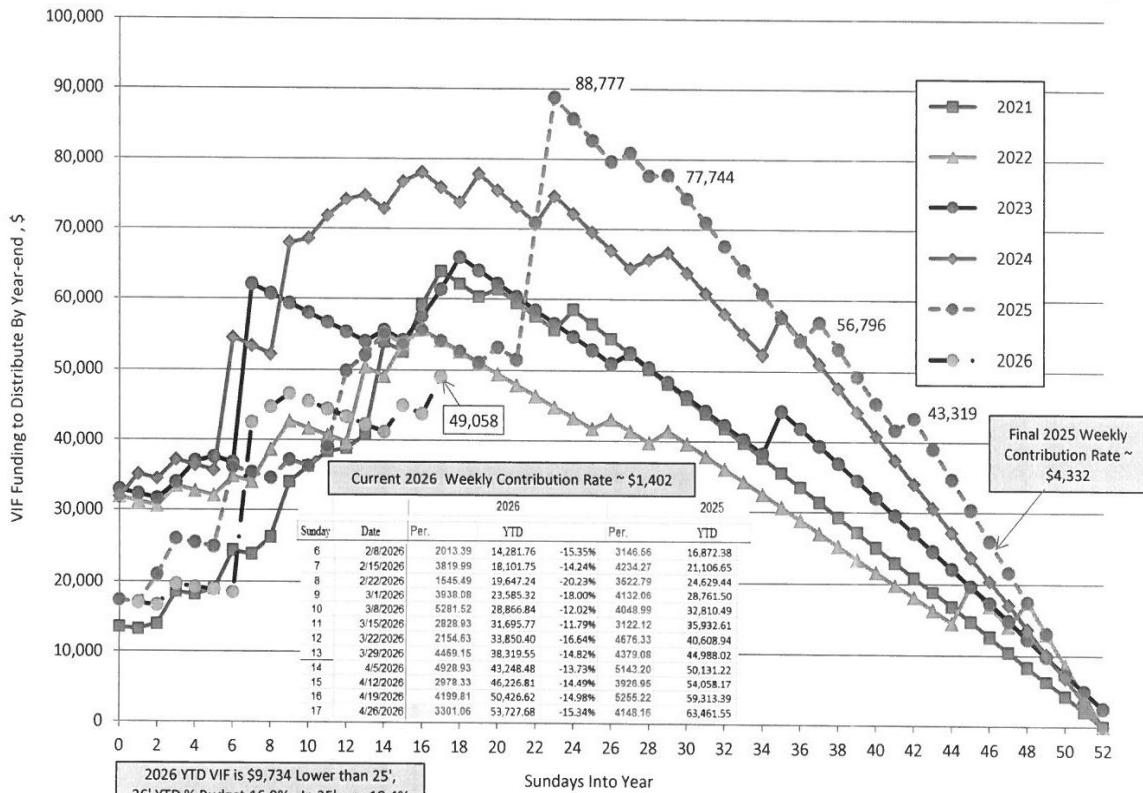
### Year to Date - Comparative VIF Gifting Status (17 Sundays Into Year or 32.7% of 2026)

2026 VIF Gifting is about 12.5% (\$14,700) lower than that of 2025!

But: FPCN's 2026 VIF Gifting Goal is only 2.5% (\$8,663) lower than that of 2025!

26' YTD % Budget 16.0% - In 25' was 18.4%

They enjoyed socializing while partaking of an afternoon English tea with crustless finger sandwiches, scones and dainty pastries, and a variety of teas in china teacups,



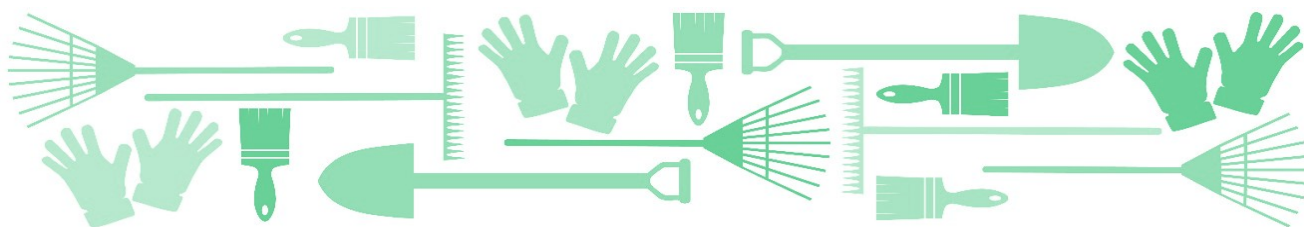

Join Delaware Right to Life for the 2026 Walk for Life in Dover on Tuesday, June 9<sup>th</sup>, from 2:00 pm to 4:00pm. We will meet at the Liberty Bell replica, located at the western end of the Green on Federal Street. After a few remarks we will proceed to Legislative Hall's East Steps for a short program of speeches before using the remaining time to meet with legislators to urge them to defeat anti-life bills.

As we did with last year's baby shoes, we would like to support Delaware's Pregnancy Centers in their good work of helping mothers choose life. This year we ask that our Pro-Life Community donate onesies by using this link:

- 3:15 p.m. - head inside to meet with legislators and urge them to support pro-life bills; a bullet list of talking points will be on the back of the fans we give out
- 4 p.m. - return home
